The favourable first impression of 106 PAVILION ROAD on the other hand was confirmed on closer inspection. The detailing is restrained and straightforward (especially the dormers) and the whole is a project HIGHLY COMMENDED as an exemplar for others in reviving the quality of an architecturally somewhat compromised street.

On balance, however, the lively discussion was regarded as confirmation of the success of the project. This is a period building renewed in a refreshing and delightful way, without inhibition or excess. The work is equally good on all elevations and the decisions made regarding changes have been sound. The addition of the glazed lantern to the skyline was admired and an AWARD is well deserved.

The Royal Borough possesses some of the finest buildings, groups of buildings and townscape in the country. The Council is proud of this heritage and is concerned that new development is of appropriate quality.

To this end, since 1977, the Planning and Conservation Committee has made annual awards to schemes which it considers set an example in their inherent quality and respect for, or contribution to, their setting. The awards are grouped into categories and include concern for the encouragement of design excellence at a small scale.


